




Connor Brothers Books 1-10 Summary

A funny and sweet scene.</p>	<p>Austin Bradberry</p> <p>We also first met Austin in Inspire Me, Book 8 as Ian’s flighty brother. Austin grows up in this book and learns that he wants a different type of woman than the ones he’s been dating.</p> <p>Favorite scene: When he teaches ski lessons and the rock-climbing class. He’s so patient with Luci and the kids. I also like that he ignores the ski bunnies.</p>	<p>Doug & Amelia</p> <p>These two add a romantic side story and they each provide their own humorous perspectives on what’s happening between Luci and Austin. I love Doug’s reaction to Austin’s ex-girlfriends and Amelia’s attempts to booster Luci’s confidence to stand up to the meddlesome Mrs. Chen. They get their own book in Book 11.</p>

She dated Cooper in high school and thought he was “the one”. When he moves back to town, she debates whether her attraction to him is worth another possible heartbreak.</p> <p>Favorite scenes: Nightly walks with Cooper and Peanut.</p>	<p>Cooper Reed (Chief)</p> <p>This book is our first time to meet Cooper. He moved away from Connor’s Grove after high school and has just moved back as the new fire chief. When he sees Mary Sue all his old feelings for her come rushing back.</p> <p>Favorite scene: His creative marriage proposal to Mary Sue.</p>	<p>Dylan</p> <p>Dylan is an aged-out foster kid who asks Mary Sue for a job at the bakery. As the story progresses, it’s so much fun to watch Dylan grow and mature, plus learn how to trust others. His slang wars with the Chief are priceless.
